**Welcome to a special edition of the stakeholder bulletin to provide you with an update on the role Cheshire Constabulary and the Office of the Police & Crime Commissioner is playing in helping to deal with the ongoing national emergency regarding the Coronavirus pandemic.**

We are committed to doing everything we can, working alongside our partners, to play our part in the national effort.

Internally, we have established a dedicated team of officers and staff to support Cheshire's response in dealing with coronavirus based issues and to provide advice, guidance and reassurance.

We are also fully engaged with all of our key partners as part of the Cheshire Local Resilience Forum and there are daily meetings and discussions as part of this process.

Our police officers, PCSOs and members of the Special Constabulary remain as visible as possible in the local community providing vital reassurance and support to both residents and businesses (including those that remain open and those that have had to close).

It has now been two weeks since the new public health regulations came into force and it has been encouraging to see so many people in Cheshire being supportive, taking on board the advice and staying at home where they can – and we hope that this will continue over the bank holiday weekend.

This is an unprecedented public health emergency and we are all having to make adjustments to the new measures, which are in place. We appreciate the difficulties and uncertainties that this brings and we want to

reassure you that our officers and staff are working extremely hard and doing their very best in really challenging circumstances to keep people safe and protect the NHS.

The aim of our officers is always to engage with people, explain the reasons behind the new regulations, encourage them to take it on board and support the people we serve to ensure that everyone is fully complying with these restrictions. We police by consent and maintaining public confidence and caring for our communities is paramount so enforcement will always be a last option.

This bulletin provides you with a snapshot of key updates from the force over the past week. We will continue to provide you with a weekly update in this format during the pandemic.



## Coronavirus emergency response fund

Cheshire's police and crime commissioner David Keane has launched a new fund to help community organisations, voluntary groups and those in the non-for-profit sector support communities through the crisis. The fund is part of the Commissioner's Safer Communities Fund and will be funded by money taken from Cheshire criminals under the Proceeds of Crime Act. Grants of up to £1,000 will be available for projects which are working alongside Cheshire police and local authorities to support vulnerable people in the community.

## Domestic abuse campaign to support those in isolation

A campaign to encourage those suffering from domestic abuse to seek support during the Coronavirus crisis has been launched by Cheshire's police and crime commissioner and chief constable. PCC David Keane and chief constable Darren Martland are working with Cheshire's four local councils to put up posters in places like supermarkets and pharmacies to provide details of the support available and where to find it.

## Police station helpdesks open across Cheshire

A number of helpdesks will be open across Cheshire for residents who have no other means of reporting crime during the coronavirus lockdown. A total of 16 police stations will open for one hour a day to offer a service for members of the public who cannot contact the Constabulary online or via the phone. These helpdesks will be for urgent issues where there is no other way of contacting police and social distancing measures will be adopted to ensure that everyone is kept safe.

As part of our neighbourhood policing commitment, local officers and PCSOs are continuing to use innovative methods to provide support to communities across Cheshire whilst taking into account social distancing measures. PCSOs are holding virtual surgeries via social media and, in some areas, are still holding face-to-face surgeries where it is safe to do so and social distancing can be put in place. Local officers and PCSOs are also continuing to safely carry out welfare checks on vulnerable residents and are working with businesses to ensure premises which have closed due to government measures remain secure.
